Minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners, Fire District No. 1 was held on Tuesday, January 8, 2019 at 7:00 P.M.

Commissioner John C. Kenny called the meeting to order.

Maria Bucsanszky: Mr. President – All the requirements of the "Open Public Meeting Act" have been complied with by advertising in the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger. Copies of the meeting notice have been sent to the Municipal Clerk's Office and posted on the bulletin boards of the fire house and the post offices of Woodbridge and Sewaren. Mr. President, you may proceed.

Commissioner John C. Kenny led a pledge to the flag.

A moment of silence was observed for our departed members and for our men and women serving overseas and especially for the firefighter from New York that passed away in the Line of Duty.

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 11th, 2018 Regular Meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: If everyone is okay we will go to the public portion of the budget and do that and take care of that.

Commissioner Patrick Kenny made a motion to go to the public portion of the budget which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously.

Kenneth Gardner: Mr. President.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yes.

Kenneth Gardner: I just wanted to ask, the items that were voted on with the referendum are now all part of the budget.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Correct.

Kenneth Gardner: Right, and you know in light of the closeness of the election I would ask the Board to consider maybe making some adjustments. The volunteer van, I know it's been talked about somewhat and I'm just speaking for myself but you know I haven't really found a volunteer that is in favor of it. I'm not sure...I know

we talked about the traffic safety and you know we just got some new vests and we've been going on the highway for years. If the call is cancelled early I know that you know you were sending people back so that's something you might want to look at. I know we have a bunch of Fire Prevention cars that aren't used during the evening. Maybe with you know the new chief if a new vehicle is going to be bought maybe you know you can put a plow on a new vehicle instead of getting you know a pickup with a plow and then you know another vehicle maybe you can combine them and you know if any of the other officers need a vehicle you know it's in the evening they could you know use some you know one of the Fire Prevention vehicles. Just maybe some ideas to you know consolidate and not buy as many. I'd like to see the budget pass you know. I think all of us here are against government shutdowns and all this stuff going on in Washington and even when the closeness of the budget in Trenton. Nobody wants to see that happen. I want to see the budget pass and I think that you know if maybe some considerations would be made the Board certainly could you know just make a public statement after consideration that you're going to cut back a little bit in light of the closeness of the vote and that may I think help get some more public support for it.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay thank you, anybody else? Just so you know Ken we did go to the auditor and we did ask for an opinion from the auditor, right Maria?

Maria Bucsanszky: Correct.

Commissioner J.C.K.: And unfortunately the way the question was written we have to do or expend as the question was written because we did want to look to see about trying to do some offsets and stuff like but the way the question is written you have a question, am I correct on that?

Maria Bucsanszky: Yes he was saying the same thing that you are locked into the purchases that you have (inaudible).

Commissioner J.C.K.: But we are trying to look at different ways to see what we can come up with.

Kenneth Gardner: I mean I'm sorry but I completely disagree with that opinion. I don't think there's anything that requires you to buy everything that was agreed to. You may not be able to add things to it, new items, but for instance if you didn't buy the van, I don't think this requires you to buy the van or anything else, and you know maybe a plow on it's on own is not something that you know just the ploy itself but not a truck maybe that's not something that would fit into a question you know as it did years ago when we you know that was only a couple of years ago we bought the other thing so maybe if the new vehicle that you were to get I'm sure you know they're capable of handling plows as the ones we have but I would ask you know Trenton for that in writing and make them tell you that you got to do that because I don't believe that. Otherwise after that vote was over it would be done; you wouldn't have to have it as part of your budget. So now you have a separate vote on the budget

you know that doesn't really make sense. So again I don't know all the answers but from what I understand I think you should push a little further and maybe there could be some flexibility.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay.

Kenneth Gardner: And maybe DCA should give an opinion.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I will report to the auditor tomorrow again, anybody else?

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to close the public portion of the budget which was seconded by Commissioner Todd Howell and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Now we go to adopting, correct, which is 2019-1-2. I need a motion for that.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to adopt Resolution 2019-1-2 which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously by a roll call vote. Commissioner John Kenny – Yes; Commissioner Minkler – Yes; Commissioner Howell – Yes; Commissioner Patrick Kenny – Yes; Commissioner Moran – Yes.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, that takes care of that part there Maria?

Maria Bucsanszky: Correct.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Now we will go back into the regular meeting and we will start with Personnel and Liaison to the Volunteer Fire Company – Commissioner Moran.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

PERSONNEL AND LIAISON TO THE VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY:

Commissioner J.M.: No unusual personnel issues with the volunteer or the career side. Training hours for the department were 44 hours in December and there are several members of the department enrolled in spring courses at the Middlesex County Fire Academy for the upcoming term. That's my report.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Any questions for Commissioner Moran?

Commissioner T.H.: No sir.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, Apparatus – Vehicles – Commissioner Howell.

APPARATUS - VEHICLES:

Commissioner T.H.: The following is the report abbreviated. Campbell Supply are having a little problem down there. The fellow Nate who's in charge, he's out for surgery, so we're dealing with a second individual; it's working out quite well. He expects to have our ladder repaired on Thursday and it'll be certified on Monday and will be back here the next day according to the current plan. As far as Engine 1-3 the parts will be in at the end of this week and the repairs will be completed. That's the end of my report. The rest of the items are very minor. I ask that the rest of this report be entered into the minutes Maria.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, any questions for Commissioner Howell? Alright, moving on to Fire Prevention Bureau and Telecommunications and Hydrants – Commissioner Minkler.

WHEREAS, the adopted budget is in compliance with the Property Tax Levy Cap Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.44 et. seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as presented for adoption reflects Total Revenues of \$ 9,154,838, which includes amount to be raised by taxation of \$7,961,439, and Total Appropriations of \$9,154,838; and

WHEREAS, an election shall be held annually on the third Saturday of February in each established fire district to determine the amount to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District at an open public meeting held on January 8, 2019 that the Annual Budget of the Fire District for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2019 and ending December 31, 2019, is hereby adopted and shall constitute appropriations for the purposes stated and authorization of Total Revenues of \$9,154,838, which includes amount to be raised by taxation of \$7,961,439, and Total Appropriations of \$9,154,838; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Annual Budget as presented for adoption reflects each item of revenue and appropriation in the same amount and title as set forth in the introduced and approved budget, including all amendments thereto. if any, which have been approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an annual election shall be held on the third Saturday of February to determine the amount to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year. The results of which shall be subsequently certified to the Division and the Municipal Assessor.
