A moment of silence was observed for our departed members and for our men and women serving overseas.

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2019 Regular Meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Todd Howell and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I need a motion to go into Executive Session for legal and personnel matters.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to go into Executive Session for legal and personnel matters which was seconded by Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. and carried unanimously at 6:32 P.M.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to return to the Regular Meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Jeffrey Moran and carried unanimously at 9:25 P.M.

Commissioner J.C.K.: I need a motion to take all reports from all Committees and to make that part of the minutes of the meeting.

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to take all reports from all Committees and make that part of the minutes of the meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Patrick Kenny and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: We'll move on to the Report of Payroll and Bills.

#### The report of Payroll and Bills for October, 2019:

Maria Bucsanszky: The report of Payroll and Bills for the month of October, 2019.

Bills: \$159,034.44

Payroll: \$333,959.92.

Commissioner T.H.: I'll make a motion that we approve the Bill List along with six add-on bills for a total of \$119,853.97.

Commissioner Todd Howell made a motion to accept the Payroll and Bills plus the six additional add-on bills for a total of \$119,853.97 which was seconded by Commissioner Jeffrey Moran and carried unanimously except for Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. abstaining on Voucher 18727 and 18714 and voting yes on all the others and Commissioner Todd Howell abstaining on Voucher 18691 and voting in favor of all the others.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Treasurer's Report. I need a motion to take that as far as the minutes of the meeting.

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to take the Treasurer's Report as far as the minutes of the meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Todd Howell and carried unanimously.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Communications.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS:**

Maria Bucsanszky: All communications were passed through to the Commissioners.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, at this time Mr. Attorney do you want to give a summary of what took place in Executive Session, a very lengthy one?

Christopher Howell, Attorney: Thank you Mr. President. The Executive Session tonight consisted of the following: We first discussed purchasing of new gear and our ongoing potential purchase of 109 Green Street. We then moved on to LOSAP. We reviewed our current point system and qualifying events and we heard from Chief Fee and Chief Hapstak on some recommendations and maybe changing LOSAP or modifying it. We then moved on to scheduling our 2020 Budget Workshop dates for the upcoming budget. We then discussed the recently elected volunteer officers for 2020. We looked at their requirements and qualifications. We speak with President Jeff Golden and discussed those qualifications and the officers who were elected which involved personnel. We then heard from Chief Kenny on some personnel matters, one involving Employee 1285 and also about the Deputy Chief position. We then moved on to a lengthy discussion about the Chain of Command both in volunteers and paid department. We heard from two Battalion Chief Officers and we also heard from two Volunteer Chiefs and that would conclude our Executive Session tonight Mr. President.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, thank you. I'd like to make a motion unless somebody has something on Old Business and New Business. Does anyone have anything under either one of them?

Commissioner R.M.: Not at this time Mr. President.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: No.

Commissioner J.M.: Just one point that two of our new hires, Miss Jane Oh and Gilbert Rivera, have completed Firefighter One training at the Fire Academy.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Good, I think they start Fire Two on Monday am I correct?

Commissioner J.M.: Yes.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay I need a motion to put a 21 day posting up for Deputy Chief.

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to put a 21 day posting up for Deputy Chief which was seconded by Commissioner Todd Howell and carried unanimously

Commissioner J.C.K.: The other one is Resolution 2019-10-2 which is for the Chain of Command and the change of the Chain of Command will be the Career Chief, the Deputy Chief, the Battalion Chief, the Paid Captain, the Volunteer Chief, the Volunteer Assistant Chief, the Volunteer Captain, the Volunteer Lieutenant and the Ex-Chief and Chief Charles Kenny will then put all the papers and all the i's and the t's and the z's into it and then we'll sit with each of the shifts and once he has completed that then Chief Kenny has the authorization to implement it into place.

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to authorize Resolution 2019-10-2 which was seconded by Commissioner Jeffrey Moran and carried unanimously by a roll call vote. Commissioner Howell – Yes; Commissioner – Moran; Commissioner John Kenny – Yes; Commissioner Minkler – Yes; Commissioner Patrick Kenny – Yes.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Then the meeting for December 4<sup>th</sup> will be at 6:00 P.M. and that will be for the Budget Workshop and then going into the regular business. Now I'll move over to the Remarks, Comments and Questions from the Audience. Does anyone have anything to say from the audience?

### REMARKS, COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE:

Deputy Director of Police Joseph Nisky: I have two different things I want to speak about and I'll be brief. First, on behalf of the Woodbridge Police Department, I wanted to thank Local 290 for their presence at the Council meeting last night in support of our police department. Your presence there did not go unnoticed and was greatly appreciated by our entire police department so thank you for being there. The second thing I have I want to kind of say that I'll address Pat and the incredible job he did yesterday in another setting but this has to do with the career crew that showed up

at the plane crash yesterday. I was one of the first people there and had to make sure that the cops were evacuating the residents and setting up a perimeter and your career crew it seemed like they were there almost immediately and went right to work and did an incredible job. At one point I found myself towards the back of the three houses that were on fire and the four guys that were on the engine they had a line stretched and they were literally in the middle of the most intense part of the fire so I'm no firefighter but I have to tell you I made it a point to track down each one of those guys at the incident yesterday and told them, you know, how I felt about what I saw and I think they did an excellent job and I've told everybody that I know and there were a lot of people out there that did a great job but your four guys in particular they were there quickly, they had a line stretched and as far as I could see they were in the most intense area of the fire so I wanted to come here and let them know that.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Thank you, Chief.

Chief Charles Kenny: Just to follow up on that I know it's been a long night but Deputy Chief Golden was there and came back yesterday with the same report that the guys over there did a fantastic job and did not stop working until it was time to go back.

Commissioner J.C.K.: There was one little tiny email that Chief Golden did send out and I do want to recognize for that. We did a home inspection for an older gentlemen in the township and he actually wrote back about the professionalism that they gave and how they helped him and did the home inspection and got him the necessary safety equipment for his home to make sure that he was safe so he did send that out to Chief Golden and Chief Golden made me aware of that.

Commissioner J.M.: Battalion Chief Minkler, Captain Weber and his sort. That was Stu Brandow's house?

Commissioner J.C.K.: Yes, so anybody have anything else?

Commissioner Robert Minkler, Sr. made a motion to adjourn the meeting which was seconded by Commissioner Todd Howell and carried unanimously at 9:35 P.M.

#### Alarm Response - Chain of Command 5.2

## All Alarms within Fire District 1:

The command of an incident within Fire District 1 is assumed in the following order:

- Deputy Fire Chief
- Battalion Chief
- Career Captains
- Volunteer Fire Chief
- Assistant Volunteer Fire Chief
- Volunteer Captain
- Volunteer Lieutenant
- Senior career personnel
- Mutual Aid Company
- Command may be passed on in descending order consistent with the above chain of
- The first on scene will establish Incident Command. As additional personnel arrive on scene, the Incident Commander will be determined by ranking outlined above and will assume command.

## All Alarms Outside Fire District 1:

The Career apparatus operator shall not assume incident command.

The command of an incident outside of District 1 is assumed in the following order:

- Volunteer Chief or Volunteer Assistant Chief
- Volunteer Captain
- Volunteer Lieutenant
- Ex-Chief
- Ex-volunteer officers
- Career Officer
- Senior career personnel
- Mutual Aid Company

# 5.3 Alarm Response - Establishing Command at Fire Scene

Upon arrival to any fire scene which does not have an Incident Command structure in place, the senior officer in charge will establish Incident Command.

The procedure of establishing Incident Command will give guidance and direction to all fire personnel and associated agencies, i.e. Dispatch, EMS, etc. on scene.

This guideline does not supersede the guideline presently in place for incident chain of command. The intent of this guideline is to fill any current void regarding incident command.
