We went over and evaluated our AutoAid. All parties are very happy with how it's going. We are looking and discussing expanding it. Avenel is looking to take more of our area or may expand more into theirs. Port Reading, we're going to be doing like we do with Avenel during the weekdays where they go to the first alarm we'll be sending someone as a safety officer and also we put out there that if you know when we're working during weekdays if they need any other help with any

other command staff we would be more than happy to help them out with that so that is a successful program and we should have more details on any expansion by the next meeting.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay great, any questions for the Chief?

Commissioner R.M.: Great job.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay, great, we'll move on to New Business – Commissioner P. Kenny.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: I didn't get an answer back from Marta from the Town nor did I get an answer back from Neglia who's our proposed engineer architect for the renovations to the front of the firehouse. I made some minor changes to their contract. I got an acknowledgement that they would, you know, look at that and respond and they didn't do that so I'll follow up with Neglia and I'll do the same with Lisa S. Maybe Mr. President if you could reach out as well I know you've had some conversations with her.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Did Brett reach out to the Marta?

Christopher Howell, Attorney: No Brent's position is you know everything should run either through me or through the architect, Kevin Settembrino. I had several conversations with Kevin. Kevin agreed that I'd be the lead on it sending a letter. The issue is, is this is a conditional resolution to get the approval done. There were minor conditions. We met all them. We sent in those conditions on March 6th so the

issue that might be still pending is potentially an engineering issue which would be Brent Papi's lead on that. But Brent has no idea what exactly that is and neither do I so that's what the letter basically said is we met the conditions that were in the written resolution. If you have engineering issues please let us know what they are and in writing so that it's not a gray area and I'm waiting for a response back from the Zoning Board. Provided we meet all those conditions whether there are any outstanding or not we've been told it would be moved on to the Building Department for permits so I will follow up. The letter went out about a week ago. I'll follow up with Marta on Monday and see where she's at with that.

Commissioner J.C.K.: Okay.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: You haven't heard from Neglia have you?

Commissioner J.C.K.: I think Lisa was reaching out to him today. I think the latest I knew it was in their attorneys because it's different then your (inaudible) contract.

Christopher Howell, Attorney: Yeah, I mean again we're just you know dropping some of the limits and got rid of some minor language in it. It's not a major change. I don't think it would be a deal breaker on their part. You know I did ask for them to name us as their lost pay on their insurance policy if we do hire them. This way we have coverage and that was it so yeah hopefully we'll get a response back from them shortly.
